Greetings to our friends everywhere,

OVER THE COURSE OF THIS YEAR we have tilled the soil and planted the seeds of leadership in our classes. We've watched and waited. Now we see the fruits of our labor.

With a membership of 42 students, our Class of 2008 has accepted the mantle of leadership and joins our ranks as alumni. There is a class that produced four National Merit Finalists (once again, out of ten in the diocese) and four Commended Scholars. The scholarships they were offered totaled 5.3 million dollars. Phenomenal, absolutely phenomenal! Schools they are attending range from Thomas More College to John Carroll University to Washington University in St. Louis. The foundation they have grown from is an ACT score of 29, ranking them markedly above last year's average of 20.7 in the state and 21.2 in the nation. Phenomenal!

Our language classes continue to dominate the field. Various awards were given to over 76% of our students who took the National Latin Exam — 39 Summa Cum Laude medals, 32 Maxima Cum Laude medals, 17 Magna Cum Laude medals and 15 Cum Laude medals! Two perfect papers were also achieved on this exam. Our German students earned first and second place awards at the annual German Day held at the University of Cincinnati. Remember, we are a two year program, beating four year German programs. Phenomenal!

Students continue to show leadership in the community through engaging in programs ranging from inner-city school tutoring programs to taking senior citizens to prom to assisting with the Cinderella's Closet prom dress program for the needy. Various fund raisers throughout the year raise money for our mission in Africa and for food agencies like Food for the Poor. So much need is out there, and our students are answering the call by proving to be leaders through their presence and hard work to meet the need. Phenomenal!

In the sports arena, our teams have won various tournaments, the girls basketball team winning their first

ever! Our girls track team placed 10th in state out of 36 teams. Soccer is alive and well, with both the boys and girls winning various tournaments throughout the season and placing members on all-tournament teams. The same occurred with our volleyball team. Phenomenal!

Finally, we take a step in our expansion process by adding another building to our campus. The former St. Mary's School across from the Cathedral, also known as the Cathedral Lyceum, will be ours to use. It will assist us with easing our space needs now and allow us a place to temporarily house our student body when we are ready to build an addition to our main building. In the meantime, students will be moving between buildings while attending classes. Some offices will be moved to St. Mary's, as well as some dedicated storage space. We continue to work on developing a plan for building an addition, trying to provide the best possible facilities for our student body. Phenomenal!

As always, because of you we continue to do what we are called to do: creating leaders for the 21st century. Whether it's through your kind gifts to the Academic Advancement Fund or service to the school by serving on a committee or looking out for us in terms of equipment and furniture, we are providing the best opportunity for these young women and men to take advantage of in developing their skills and talents. They are fully aware of the sacrifices you make to advance their education, so rest assured that you are remembered in our prayers at Mass and other community assemblies of prayer. We cannot do it without YOU!

We ask for your continued support and prayers. You are a tremendous source of encouragement in maintaining our special Catholic education.

JETS Competition: Another Big Year

Each year the Junior Engineering Technical Society, JETS, holds a regional competition at the University of Cincinnati. This academic competition challenges students from area high schools to apply science and math knowledge to solve real-world engineering problems.

This year the school's JV team placed second in Division II. Our varsity team placed first, also in Division II. The team was awarded a \$5,000 scholarship that can be split among team members who will enroll at UC in engineering in the fall. On the national level, the JV team placed 14th and the varsity team placed 18th in the country, both in Division II.

After the local JETS competition, the UC Engineering Tribunal hosted an Egg Drop Contest. The aptly named Leonardo DaVinci awards were given to the top three devices with the most creative design. Paul Vine and William Banks placed second in that competition. ☆

Introducing the Class of 2008

This Class of 2008 was amazing! Their average ACT composite score was 29 (out of 36) ranking in the 92nd percentile in the nation, and their SAT average was 1877 (out of 2400) ranking in the 87th percentile in the nation. Four seniors were named National Merit Finalists, with another four named Commended students, thirteen earned Commonwealth Diplomas, all of the Kentucky students earned KEES scholarships, and this class of 42 earned over \$5.3 million in scholarship offers, with an average of over \$126,000 per senior, AND they all survived the Latin, German and Spanish Orals!

A Prodigious Language Haul!

Results below are, in many ways, typical of the performance of Latin School students each year in language competitions, be they local, state or national. Here for the first time, however, starting with national testing, is a complete listing of the results of those performances. As Andy Barczak says, "phenomenal!"

National Greek Exam Results — Senior Veronica Clogrove received a second place and senior Michael Daugherty received a third place. Junior Kelly King received a second place and junior Ian Takaoka received a third place.

Senior Michael Daugherty earned the Book Award in the Classical Association of the Middle West and Southern States (CAMWS) sight exam contest. He was one of 349 entrants taking the exam. The CAMWS award for outstanding performance in the classics was awarded to seniors Michael Daugherty and Sam Rodgers.

National Latin Exam Results — 104 out of 137 (76%) received awards with 39 Summa Cum Laude (gold), 32 Maxima Cum Laude (silver), 17 Magna Cum Laude and 15 Cum Laude awards. Emily Zalla and Grant Berberich had perfect papers. Seniors Sam Rodgers, Lauren Helton, Paul Vine, Kristina Satek and Emily Zalla each received an Oxford Classical Dictionary for earning a gold medal (Summa Cum Laude) on the National Latin Exam four years in a row.

Forty students were inducted into the National Latin Honor Society. These students required a minimum 90% average in Latin

class this year.

In the National Medusa Mythology Exam, Tyler Heist and Brad Martin each earned the Corona Olivae award, Emily Ernst and Anthony Kenkel the Corona Laurea award, and Paul Vine the Bronze Medal.

Senior Paul Vine won a silver Tetradrachma coin – posthumous issue minted by one of Alexander's generals, Seleukos I, circa 305-295 BCE. Paul scored a 93% in an on-line image contest about Alexander the Great. The coin was donated by Charlie Rhodes. Senior Sam Rodgers also won an on-line image contest on Roman History. For his efforts he received a silver denarius coin depicting Roman Emperor Trajan. His coin was donated by David Sear, a well-known numismatist, and is valued at more than \$200. Students participated in these and other contests through the program Ancient Coins for Education which puts ancient coins into the hands of students. Latin teacher Kelly Kusch received a coin reference book on Imperial Roman coins and their values, written and signed by David Sear, which he generously donated for classroom/coin project use.

German Day Results — German Day is held annually at the University of Cincinnati. Robert Poston and George Kreutzjans earned first place in Conversation First Level, and Rachel Martin and Molly Guilfoyle earned third place in Second Level; Greg Light earned second place in Reading First Level; Annabelle Arbogast earned a first place and Austin Shumate a third place in Grammar Second Level.

National German Exam Results — Fourteen senior German students took the National German Exam, with five placing in the region: Annabelle Arbogast, first place; William Banks, second place; Rachel Martin, third place; Jake Smith, fifth place; and Alex Antony, seventh place.

Kentucky State Foreign Language Competition Results
